A message from the Dean...

I wish to express my gratitude and thanks to this wonderful chapter for nominating and electing me (me!) DEAN. It is such an honor. As I look at the list of past deans, usually found on a page in the handbook (I know these names from years ago), I am humbled to join those names that have represented to me the ultimate in organ skill and knowledge. Beginning this new season, I feel a sense of wonder, thankfulness and appreciation to the membership, whose renewal rate has been greater than 90%, and to the members of the Board who have generously volunteered to chair various events, call members, take care of the finances, get out the newsletter and work on the handbook which is a huge project. They also make me laugh whenever we get together.

Believe it or not, researchers in the field of positive psychology have been studying the effect of gratitude on health and well-being for years. Robert Emmons and Michael McCullough are two of the leading American investigators who describe gratitude as the "ability to be keenly aware of the good things that happen to you and never take them for granted." When grateful individuals express their thanks and appreciation to others in a heartfelt way, they feel greater serenity, contentment and satisfaction with life. By the same token, research subjects who had insufficient appreciation of good events and an overemphasis of bad experiences were

more stressed about and less content with nearly everything.

But, how do you increase your feelings of gratitude when nothing seems to be going right?

The choir room is disorganized, members have called to drop out, you can't find good new anthems or preludes, the secretary wants the music 7 days in advance for the bulletin, salaries are being lowered, and there's big competition with the "praise band". Are we going through difficult times? Yes. That's why it makes so much sense to *practice* gratitude, in good times and bad. It may be human nature to notice all that is wrong or that we lack, but if we give ourselves the chance on a regular basis to notice all of life's gifts and blessings, we can increase our sense of well-being, and create hope and optimism for the future—no matter what is going on. So be sure to begin your year by thanking all those around you who DO show up to sing or play an instrument, thank God for the wonderful privilege of worshiping through music, and celebrate most joyously our being here at all. Hope to see you at the opening event: Thanks to Jerry Lesniak and Joe Finnegan for opening their lovely Hampden home where we'll install officers on their backyard patio and listen to a demonstration of their lovely in-house pipe organ.
