A message from the Dean...

The Quimby Competition....

The Guild treasury supported the recent Quimby Competition to the tune of \$900. Since it is your money, I guess you'd like to know how and why it was spent, eh? Well, I, too, was wondering so I went....and now I can tell you first hand. It absolutely "blew me away"...

The Quimby Regional Competition for Young Organists (RCYO), held in oddnumbered years, is sponsored and administered by the nine regions of the American Guild of Organists. Competitors must be under 24 years of age as of August 1 of the year the competition is held. Membership in the AGO is not required. Prizes at the Chapter levels vary. Our Chapter combined with the Fairfield (CT) Chapter and held the event at Center Church in Hartford. We offered a \$600 first prize, a \$300 second prize and a \$100 third prize. We also hired three great judges at a mere \$100 each and paid Center Church \$500 for using the space and tuning the organ as well as arranging rehearsal times for the competitors. The grand total was \$1800 and we split it equally between the Fairfield Chapter and our own. Why Fairfield? Because they had one competitor, Ken, a Yale grad student 22 years of age. He played divinely and won the first prize.

Springfield was there and sponsoring because we have two wonderful young people who entered: Griffin McMahon, age 18 and Monica Czausz, age 17. Both of them played extremely well and both

understand that the Springfield Chapter stands solidly behind them. We also will give them scholarships to attend the POE (Pipe Organ Encounter) in Boston this coming summer. Griffin took the second prize and Monica, the third. The local winner (Ken) will compete at the regional convention in Morristown, NJ in July and the first prize winner there will receive \$1000, thanks to Michael Quimby and Quimby Organs.

It was an afternoon of terrific organ music and those in the audience had a rare treat. The audience was sparse and we were instructed to be absolutely quiet. No applause. The judges could not look at the contestants, who were sequestered until their turn came. Then they entered this quiet but beautifully classic church, sat down at the organ and began to play. It was totally intimidating but these young people did a fine job of some very difficult music. I was so proud of them. Rest assured; your dues dollars are well spent.

Meet Hedley Yost. Hedley has had a long and distinguished career. He earned his bachelor's and master's degrees at Westminster Choir College of Rider University in Princeton, NJ, was acting university organist and teaching fellow at Stanford University and pursued additional study in France with Nadia Boulanger. He held church posts in New York City and New Jersey, finally settling down to a organist-choir director position at St. Mark's Episcopal Church in New Canaan, CT, where he served a 2000 member congregation for 25 years. Some of his proudest memories are of the active children's choir there and the young boys he trained that were

accepted into the prestigious St. Thomas Choir School in New York City. He was also the artistic director of the church's Courtyard Concerts summer music series. Hedley served two terms as dean of the Fairfield West (CT) Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. Currently, Mr. Yost resides in Buckland, MA and is co-organist at St. John's Episcopal Church in Ashfield. When he's not at the console, Hedley can be found outdoors on his 20 acres, pruning, planting and cutting up his own wood for his fireplace.
