Well September 17th was a very pleasant afternoon and for those attending Evensong at Christ Church Cathedral the day was made all the more enriching. Our new dean, Todd Beckham, oversaw the organization and direction of Evensong in the Anglican tradition. Todd directed The Diocesan Choir with choir members from Christ Church, St. Phillips, Church of the Atonement, St. Andrew's, and Grace Church. Besides Todd Beckham five chapter members also participated. They were Scott Baily, Karen Banta, Jim Barnes, Kell Julliard, and Larry Picard. After the homily on the Light of Christ delivered by The Rev. Dr. Barbara Headley, our chaplain, Father William Wallis installed our slate of seven officers as listed on the Chiff Chat banner.

Musically with the recent events in the United Kingdom there were some poignant moments that made connections with the late Queen Elizabeth. The very unusual office hymn "Jerusalem" by Charles Parry was a rare gem using a text by Wm. Blake from 1804 envisioning Christ presence on the British Isles building up Jerusalem. For myself I could not help but to think of Elizabeth who seemed to have made it to church every Sunday by car or driving a jeep. In addition there was The Sovereign's Fanfare by Arthur Bliss for the final voluntary. Again something relatively unknown to most, yet so very English and invoking sentiment for their late Queen.

Following Evensong there was a very nice reception and it proved a great time to catch up with friends and make a few new acquaintances. Thank you Todd Beckham and to the Cathedral Dean, Tom Callard, who is always so very welcoming. A sincere Thank You to everyone at Christ Church who helped host our opening event.

New hymn for Veterans Day now available

Choral planners for the services, ceremonies, and observances of Veterans Day 2022 now have a new resource to consider: a new hymn entitled, "Ever Faithful to the Call." The hymn can be reviewed and downloaded free for nonprofit use at <u>www.everfaithfultothecall.com</u>.

Composer Tom Lough turned to chaplains, veterans, family members, widows, and church music professionals for their ideas and suggestions in the hymn's development. Field testing of the hymn in late 2021 provided additional feedback for the final revisions. The four-verse hymn was sung recently as part of an organ recital in the West Point Cadet Chapel at the United States Military Academy. Craig Williams, chapel organist, said, "I feel this hymn has the potential for widespread use in military and civilian settings for Veterans Day and other occasions as well." Lough invites university and church choral leaders to consider incorporating this hymn into their Veterans Day 2022 observances.



Nathan Laube Review

William Wordsworth once said that poetry was best "written in tranquility" so the emotion could be rekindled with greater clarity and experienced anew. Writing a review of the magnificent Nathan Laube concert in the "tranquility" of mid-week is just such an experience... a "wow" all over again. Last Sunday, Sept. 25 at 3 pm, in the Brick church of Old Deerfield. a large crowd of music lovers was immersed in an exciting master class of history and performance surrounding J. S. Bach, presented by Nathan Laube, a delightful young organ professor from Eastman School, who entertained his audience with interesting back stories of each musical selection. The program consisted of works from Bach's contemporaries that INFLUENCED BACH (Bohm, Muffat) followed by works of the masters who in turn were influenced BY BACH (Mendelssohn, Mozart). For comparison purposes, each was followed by a Bach

composition demonstrating the connection culminating in one of Bach's finest works composed in his most prolific period: the great *Passacaglia BWV 582.* It was a fabulous concert filled with passion and technical skill.



The Brick Church Music series, managed by Jean Turner, is audience friendly, providing a large screen which transmits images of the organ, zooming in on the organists' feet or hands by an unseen camera operator. Members of the audience who decline to climb the stairs to the balcony actually have a better view of the action than those who make the trek. At the conclusion of the concert, a delightful reception was held next door in the lovely paneled library of Deerfield Academy. The Series will present three more events this season, one of which is AGO sponsored organ concert by Nathaniel Gumbs on March 26, 2023.
