Dean's Message: Dear Everyone,

February marks a period when we honor the heritage of Afro-Americans who helped build our country and especially for those artists and musicians who shaped cultures and in particular music. I think of the people that I had the privilege to know and to hear their great music making such as Wendel Whalum of Morehouse College Choirs fame and David Stills who served as organist to Dr. King as well as later serving as sub-organist at Atlanta's St. Philip's Episcopal Cathedral. I think of the tremendous amount of choral and organ compositions by David Hurd who greatly influenced me after meeting him at Oberlin's Summer Organ Workshop and in the same summer won the improvisation competition at the 1977 International Congress of Organists in Philadelphia. I think of Florence Price who came from the Jim Crow South to earn music degrees from New England Conservatory at a time when women and, heaven forbid, a black woman would earn a degree. I think of Herndon Spillman who studied with Maurice Duruflé, Andre Marchal and Marie-Claire Alain and who was the only Afro-American for many years to grace the back cover of the Diapason and the American Organist where the organists under concert management are showcased.

We honor this rich heritage especially this month and I hope that we who are members of the AGO will take a moment in your music planning to include hymns which honor the Afro-American musical traditions. We don't have to be able to duplicate southern gospel style to do this. I think I'll improvise a French Toccata with an old spiritual theme in the pedals for a postlude voluntary in honor of a great musician such as Herdon Spillman.

The Boar's Head Festival is BACK! January 13th-15th

After a two year hiatus due to the pandemic, Trinity United Methodist Church on Sumner Ave in Springfield brought to life their 40th presentation of the Christmas Story in Medieval style...and what a production it was! Hundreds (not exaggerated) of people dressed in authentic 1463 a.d. costumes, roamed the sanctuary singing, telling stories, admonishing street urchins, chasing a roaming rat, performing tricks, hauling in yule logs and a boar's head feast while some nuns were blessing participants with holy relics. Once the atmosphere of merriment had been set, the lights dimmed, a sprite entered to light the altar candles, followed by the Boar's Head fanfare and Carol sung by all. The majestic organ then began the Procession with Gigout's "Grand (very grand) Choeur Dialogue" which ushered in Lord and Lady Asbury who hosted the event. The many scenes that followed you must see for yourself—Wenceslas, the woodsmen, father Christmas, shepherds, three kings, dancers, bagpipers, gargoyles, and children. Adding to the excitement were the captivating array of live animals including geese, llamas, horse, falcon, goats, sheep, donkey, and three very regal camels.... —the entire universe it seems to have come to adore the infant Jesus, the highlight of the festival. Every new arrival was accompanied by a fanfare or a organ/choral composition in a delightful concert of music that was on-going by the church choirs led by our own AGO member, Dr. Michael Carney, who himself was dressed as troubador Ricardo d'Amor (pictured far right)—reflecting the obvious: that directing this music was truly a labor of love. 
